

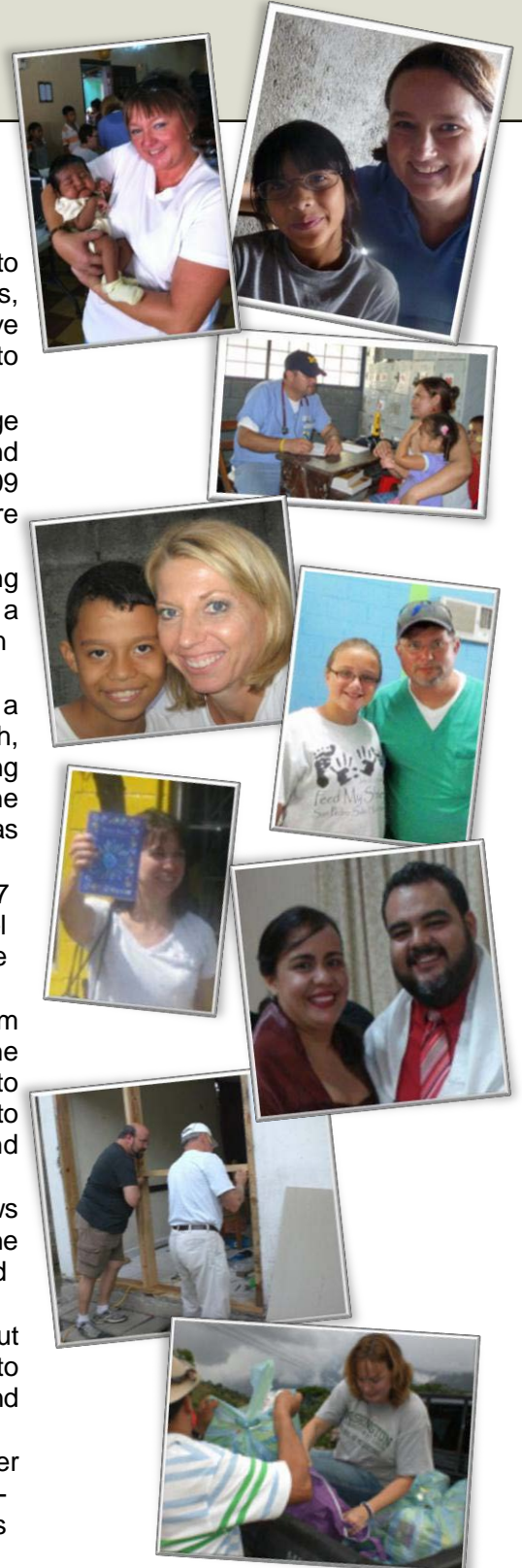

## Fall 2011 Mission Trip

- **Medical Clinics:** for many Hondurans this is the only time they are able to receive any type of medical care. During the trip the team held 3 clinics, more than 900 children and adults were seen by a doctor and receive medications for everything from treatment of intestinal parasites to breathing problems and infections.
- **Vision Clinics:** the first time a vision clinic was held with Dr. Kim Tinge and 8 team members helped by wonderful interpreters (thanks Emy and Stephanie). It was a great success, 486 patients saw the eye doctor, 109 were given prescription eyeglasses, 289 received readers, and 849 were given sunglasses.
- **Feeding Projects:** the team participated in one of the two feeding projects that provide more than 275 children with hot meals. It's a wonderful program and helps the kids where they need it the most. In 2011, 25,000 hot meals served.
- **Private Scholar Program:** the mission team was blessed by a presentation from the private scholars. They recited scripture in English, gave story summaries and performed a dance. The relationships being formed through this program are a truly life changing for everyone involved. Edy and Emy who help coordinate the program in Honduras continue to be a huge blessing to the ministry.
- **Public School Scholars:** the team checked in on the some of the 287 Christ Church scholars, they are so grateful for this opportunity. We feel that this is our most valuable project because we are able to reach the children of Honduras with hope for the future.
- **Bibles for Honduras** is a non-profit that was started by a mission team member and has to date provided over 20,000 Spanish Bibles to the people of Honduras. This trip every team member had the opportunity to experience the overwhelming desire the Hondurans have to be able to read God's Word. The team gained recognition in the local papers and TV station as they handed out 3,000 Spanish Bibles.
- **Building Project:** this fall a project was started to put doors and windows in the homes of two of the private scholars. Prior to the construction the homes had only curtains to protect them from the elements and intruders.
- **San Pedro Sula:** during the October 2011 trip a project was started to put doors and windows in the homes of two of the private scholars. Prior to the construction the homes had only curtains to cover the entrances and windows of the home.
- **Mission in the Clouds:** the team took the trip up the mountain to deliver enough food to feed 70 families, hand out clothing and provide de-worming medicine to the children. This remote village in the mountains has a special place in our hearts.



## Great Additions

A terrific four person team from Bethel United Methodist attended the trip as 4 of the 13 newcomers to the Honduras mission field.

## Meeting Spring 2012 Needs

- As the team starts preparations for the Spring 2012 mission trip (3/10/12 – 3/17/12), we will begin fund raising efforts for the following projects.
- The newly appointment pastor for the Christ Church in San Pedro Sula is in need of personal transportation, estimated costs = \$6,000.
- The building project to complete doors, windows, and indoor kitchen, estimated costs = \$1,200.
- A co-sponsor is needed to continue to send Olga to the private Christian school where she has been attending for the past 3 years, costs of sponsorship = \$175 a month and could come from a group like a Sunday School class, small group, or different families who wish to be a blessing and develop a relationship with their student.
- Scholar Laura is in need of hearing equipment, doctors are being seen and plans for implants are being considered, the estimated costs is not known, but we are seeking help from anyone who would like to help this young lady.
- Public School Scholarships will be needed for the next year, Christ Church will hold a special collection in February to help continue to send 276 students to school, cost = \$17,000

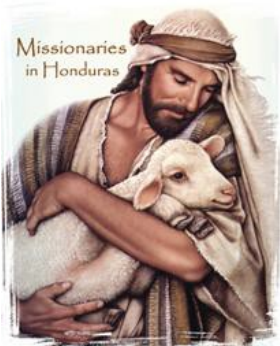
## OUR MISSION
